ZH sound at end of **garage** is shown in dictionary pronunciation guides as the letters ZH. It's the SH sound with a vibration in your throat.

Consonant Sound Partners

Many consonants have noisy partners that are the same sound with an added vibration in the throat. Speech therapists call the silent partner unvoiced and the noisy partner voiced. Compare these letters by saying the sound each picture represents. Touch your throat and feel it vibrate or not when you say the sounds below.
